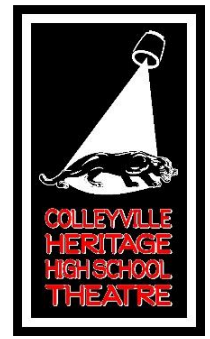

Fall Season Closes with *Starry Night*

Debut of original play written and
directed by Jacquie Devino

A very special and busy CHHS Theatre fall season ended in November with four performances of *Starry Night*. An original play written and directed by our very own **Jacquie Devino**, *Starry Night* tells the life story of famed artist Vince van Gogh. Devino's script and staging takes the audience through the harrowing and manic life of the legendary artist, giving dramatic insights to his complicated relationships, inner struggles and his ultimate demise.

The cast does a superb job of capturing and conveying the intense emotions that are the foundation of this play. All the action takes place with a backdrop consisting of a fractured rendering of one of van Gogh's most famous paintings and the namesake of this production. The set design and artwork is a metaphor for van Gogh's often broken and disjointed life and provides a striking visual frame for the production.



Starry Night, in many ways, is an example of the excellence of the CHHS Theatre Arts department. The play was written and directed by one of our Theatre Arts teachers; the cast and crew demonstrate the acting and technical skills of our students; the set design showcases the gifted visual artists at our school. for a sign-up to help divide out the orders for student pickup. They will be at school the afternoon of Friday, December 7, just in time for holiday cheer.

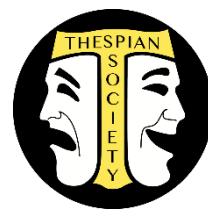

Boosters to Get Ready to Support Our Next Big Show

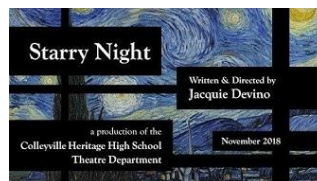


January 24 @ 7pm - 25 @ 7pm - 26 @ 2pm & 7pm
